

Development Strategy: Bassersdorf 2030



Bassersdorf drafts a development strategy as a key guideline to future development. EBP provides technical and organizational support to the municipal council in the context of drafting the strategy.

The municipality of Bassersdorf has grown significantly in recent years. Owing to its attractive location in the Glatt Valley and the high quality of life it offers as a residential community, the municipality's population has doubled since the 1990s. However, the town's close proximity to Zurich, Winterthur and Zurich Airport also presents a number of challenges, including high-volume traffic, aircraft noise and threats to its distinctive character.

What would be the best way for Bassersdorf to develop in the future? What areas should be allowed to embrace development and what areas should be protected in the interest of preserving their existing character? What would be the best way to help "Basi" retain its identity? And what should the municipality do about the increasing traffic?

In order to answer these questions, the municipal council has drafted a development strategy for the next 15 years. The strategy includes an analysis of the current situation and a list of goals relating to the following five topics: preservation of municipal identity; residential development; economic development; landscape and agricultural development; and transportation.


